# LETTER FROM BOARD CHAIR ANDRENE SMITH



Dear Friends,

This past July, I had the honor of becoming Board Chair of Girls Inc. of Westchester County after three years as Vice Chair and more than a decade of service to organizations dedicated to empowering youth in underfunded communities. My journey, from growing up in Jamaica and the Bronx, where education was my pathway to opportunity, to serving as a corporate and nonprofit leader has given me a deep and personal connection to our mission. I know firsthand what it means for a girl to have people in her corner, believing in her potential when the world seems determined to underestimate her.

This year, Girls Inc. of Westchester County served 446 girls from across the County and 85% of them were girls of color—inspiring them to be a voice and not an echo. Through leadership councils, STEM and financial literacy programs, and college and career readiness initiatives, we saw girls not just participate, but lead, innovate, and inspire. One of my proudest moments was hearing a Girls Leadership Council participant share how our facilitators helped her “find her voice instead of being an echo.” That is the transformation your support makes possible.

We also face headwinds. In an increasingly difficult political and economic climate, where resources for programs like ours are harder to secure, we have had to be more creative, more collaborative, and more relentless. We aim to strengthen partnerships with fellow nonprofits, launch new funding strategies, and plan bold new engagement efforts. This will include high-profile events and deeper connections with local leaders, which will help us expand our reach so we can serve more girls, and ultimately provide them with the resources they deserve.

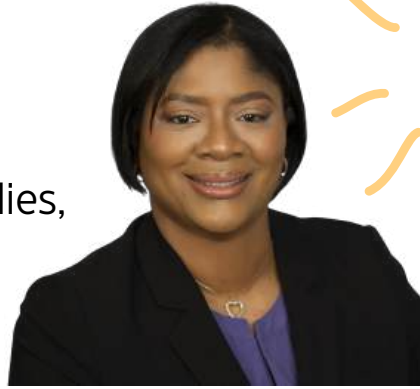
As Board Chair, my vision is clear: expand our reach, diversify our funding, and build partnerships that ensure our programs are here for the next generation of girls. That means bringing in committed new board members, leveraging AI-powered tools to connect with donors, and working closely with community partners to make our impact even greater.

Our girls are growing up in a world that challenges them daily. The question is: will we, the adults in their corner, rise to meet that challenge? 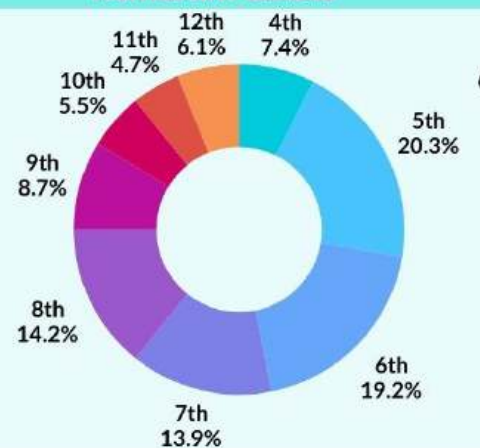

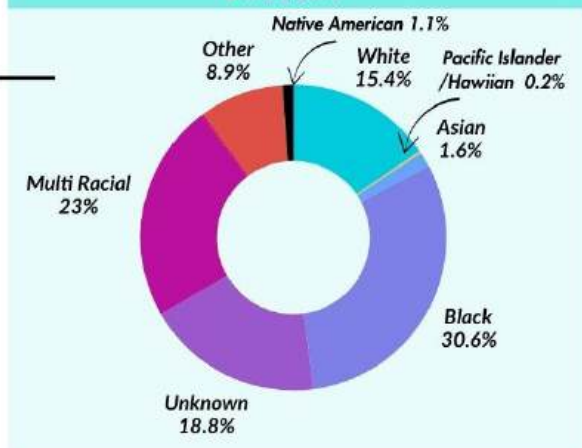

# EDUCATIONAL DEVELOPMENT

## Building Strong, Smart, & Bold Futures

We believe education is the key that opens doors to opportunity. Our educational development programs give girls the tools, knowledge, and support they need to succeed in school, prepare for higher education, and envision meaningful career paths. Through homework help, academic enrichment, college readiness workshops, and hands-on learning opportunities, girls strengthen their skills in critical subjects while also developing the confidence to advocate for themselves in the classroom and beyond. Just as importantly, our programs expose participants to new ideas, industries, and professional pathways—broadening their sense of what is possible for their futures.

### The Impact Is Clear:

**Academic Achievement** – Girls gain the confidence and skills to improve performance in school and prepare for higher education.

**Critical Thinking & Problem-Solving** – Our curriculum emphasizes life skills and decision-making, ensuring that girls leave with tools they can use in all areas of life.

**Representation & Mentorship** – Meeting women leaders, educators, and professionals helps girls see themselves reflected in positions of influence and possibility.

**Confidence in the Classroom & Beyond** – By building both knowledge and self-esteem, participants are equipped not only to achieve academically but also to lead in their communities.

For many girls in our programs, educational development is more than just learning—it’s about unlocking potential. With support, mentorship, and exposure to opportunities, they are able to imagine bold futures and take steps toward making them a reality.

## A DAY IN HER HEELS “

### Opening Doors - Expanding Futures

Our Day in Her Heels program provides girls with transformative opportunities to step into the professional world and envision themselves as future leaders. Through visits to leading corporations across Westchester and New York City, participants gain exposure to a wide range of career paths they may never have considered—or even known existed.

#### **The Impact Is Powerful:**

**Career Exploration** – Girls meet professionals in diverse fields, expanding their understanding of the many roles and opportunities that exist within an organization, from entry - level to the executive suite.

**Mentorship & Connection** – By engaging with women at all levels of the companies we visit, participants see firsthand how career journeys unfold, and they build relationships with potential role models and mentors.

**Representation & Inspiration** – Meeting women in leadership positions shows girls what is possible for them, while connecting with women in early- and mid-career roles makes success feel both tangible and attainable.

**Building Confidence** – Exposure to professional environments, networking experiences, and open conversations with accomplished women empower girls to picture themselves thriving in these spaces.

For many participants, Day in Her Heels program is their first time walking into a corporate setting. By the end of the program, they leave not only with greater awareness of career possibilities, but also with the confidence to imagine themselves there - and the motivation to pursue their own bold futures.

## Meeting Girls Where They Are

Every girl is met with care, respect, and belief in her potential. We know that no two girls' journeys are the same, which is why our programs are designed to be age-appropriate, relevant, and responsive to their lived experiences.

From middle school through high school, our professional staff and trained mentors walk alongside girls, helping them navigate challenges, celebrate successes, and plan for the future. Whether it's offering academic support, providing a safe space to talk about personal challenges, or introducing them to role models and new opportunities, our commitment is to support the whole girl—mind, body, and spirit.

### **The Strength Of Our Approach Comes From:**

**Age-Appropriate Programming** – Ensuring that the tools, resources, and conversations reflect what girls need at their stage of development.

**Mentorship & Guidance** – Trusted adults who serve not just as teachers, but as listeners, advocates, and role models.

**Holistic Support** – Addressing academic growth, emotional well-being, physical fitness, health, financial literacy, self-esteem, and leadership development in an integrated way.

**Safe, Inclusive Spaces** – Creating environments where girls feel seen, heard, and encouraged to express themselves fully.

Through mentoring and consistent support, girls learn that they are not alone. They are part of a strong community that believes in their ability to succeed and that commitment makes all the difference in helping them grow up strong, smart, and bold.

# GIRLS LEADERSHIP COUNCIL

## Developing the Next Generation of Leaders

The Girls Leadership Council (GLC) is where girls put their voices into action. This flagship program is designed to cultivate critical thinking, confidence, advocacy, public speaking, and leadership skills—the tools every young woman needs to step into her power and create change in her community.

Through hands-on projects, workshops, and mentorship, girls in the GLC learn how to analyze issues that matter to them, articulate their perspectives, and advocate for themselves and others. They practice public speaking in real-world settings, meet with community leaders, and take on leadership roles that prepare them for success in school, careers, and civic life.

### **The Council Experience Ensures That:**

**Girls Build Confidence** in their ideas and their ability to lead.

**Strengthen Critical Thinking And Decision-Making Skills** - helping them tackle challenges with clarity.

**Learn The Art of Advocacy** - raising their voices on issues that directly impact girls and women.

**Develop Public Speaking Abilities** - gaining the poise and presence to command a room.

**Step Into Leadership Roles** - modeling what it means to be strong, smart, and bold for their peers.

The Girls Leadership Council is more than a program, it's a pipeline for future leaders. By investing in these girls today, we are preparing the next generation of changemakers who will influence workplaces, communities, and the world.

*The Girls Leadership Council hosts the yearly Girls Leadership Summit, an event open to girls across the county. The 2025 theme was Fashion Sustainability. Attendees learned about the issue, its effects on the planet and ways that they can make a difference in their personal lives and community through interactive workshops.*



# BREAK PROGRAMMING

## Enriching Spaces Beyond the Classroom

For many families, school breaks can be a stressful time—when structured learning pauses but the need for safe, supportive environments does not. Our Break Programming fills this critical gap by ensuring that girls have a place to learn, explore, and grow during Winter Break, Spring Break, Summer Programs, and educational program trips.

These programs combine safety, enrichment, and opportunity. Girls spend their time engaging in activities that broaden their horizons—whether through hands-on STEM projects, exposure to the arts, career exploration trips, or workshops that spark new interests. With the guidance of caring staff and mentors, they continue building confidence, social skills, and curiosity outside of the traditional classroom setting.

### The Importance Is Clear:

**Safe Spaces** – Families can trust that their loved ones are in supportive, supervised environments while schools are closed.

**Continuous Learning** – Enrichment programs keep girls academically engaged, helping prevent learning loss and keeping curiosity alive year-round.

**Exposure & Exploration** – Field trips and experiential learning introduce girls to new ideas, careers, and opportunities they may not otherwise encounter.

**Confidence & Community** – Girls deepen friendships, practice teamwork, and strengthen their self-esteem in an empowering setting.

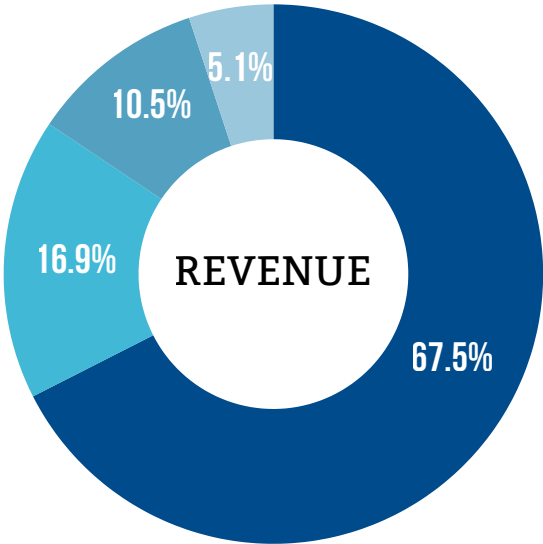

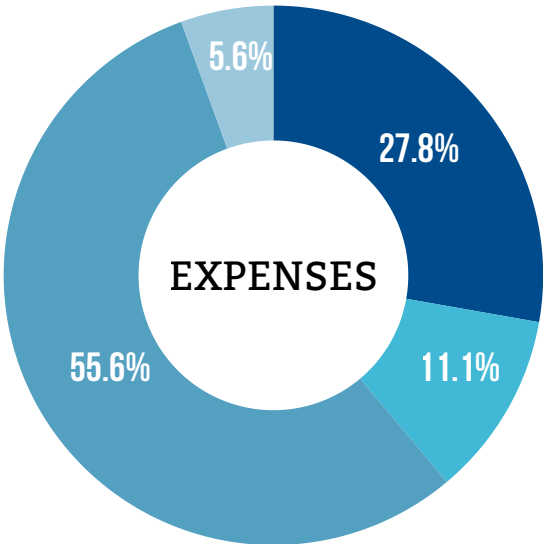
